The 7th world congress on endoscopic surgery
for endoscopic surgery of the skull base and brain
15 -18 may 2016 – Swissôtel Chicago - USA

With more than 700 attendants from all over the world, it was a unique opportunity to join the gathering of the global "Endoscopic community" and enjoy the generous contribution of over 230 faculty members coming from 42 countries, including Egypt, Saudi Arabia and Kuwait. Prof. Ricardo Carrau, the chief of the ORL-HNS Department, Ohio State University, and the head of the congress started the opening ceremony with a short review on the evolution of the Endo World meetings based on the teamwork of Otolaryngology and Neurosurgery. This was followed by 8 keynote lectures given by the honorary guests of the congress covering a range of topics from the history of endoscopy and skull base surgery, the advances in imaging, to the new technologies and robotic surgery in oncologic treatment.





The four days program included 112 exhilarating round tables comprising over 400 oral presentations, more than 200 scientific posters and oral presentations, running simultaneously in four halls. The master hall of the congress was prepared for live dissection. During the 4 days program, 21 demonstrations of different techniques were performed by two different teams of international renown. A moderator was stimulating the interaction among the surgical teams and the audience specially when dealing with controversial or differing techniques.



The meeting was attended by many of PARS members who benefited from a special reduced rate (15%) of registration for PARS members. Prof. Reda Kamel, the president of PARS, was involved in several round tables as a moderator or panelist. He welcomed all the participants coming from the Arab countries, and we had several meetings with our friends coming from Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Sudan, Jordan, Iraq, and other Arab countries.



This meeting was an outstanding educational activity providing an ideal medium for learning, professional advancement and networking in collegial and pleasurable environment.
